COMMUNITY SECURITY

The executive has being trying for quite a while to get some form of security in place, at this time we are still short of about 50 committed persons to sign the proposal to take it to 300 that is needed, we are now doubling our efforts to get this done.

We are sadden but not daunted that in a community of 700 houses (over 400 occupied) it is so difficult to get persons to sign a security proposal to protect themselves, as we can all see we are far away from the nearest police station, out in the middle of a cane field and they are stealing things from persons premises, cars and breaking into house how far are we waiting for it to reach before we get serious- until they start to rape our wives, mothers and children's or when they start to kill us one by one. This is our community, a lot us struggled to

buy our house and are still struggling to pay mortgage. Are we going to sit and wait for them to over run us before we make a stand? Some persons may be sitting and saying they haven't broken into my house or stolen my car so I am ok, you may not be affected today but who knows what tomorrow may bring, possibly something worst and it maybe too late for you.

When we had heavy rain in May 2002 and persons on Summerleyton place got flooded out, the support was lacking to get Magil/Can-Cara to fix the problem because it didn't affect all of us and it was not going to, but when Ivan came in September 2004 and the same problem caused a lot more person to be flooded then more came and wanted to take action. We can't wait for something very serious to happen before we put in security, we have got to stop it now before it gets worse and over-run the community. If they do not take over the community or let this run you out of your house your property value will go down and don't think this is impossible because if things are allowed to continue the same way it may not be far in the future before it becomes real..
